Rod's Space

This the last week in our compassion study and this week the focus is on being compassion. That is, we are a compassionate presence because of who we are.

Questions for discussion:

Think of a situation when you encountered someone who 'oozed' compassion. What were they like and what affect did they have on you?

Read Mark 11.1-11, the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. Reflect on what happened to Jesus and why he did not defend himself. In what ways was he a compassionate presence even without saying anything?

Revisit Philippians 2.1-11 from the perspective of compassion. Note what the passage says about compassion (verse 2 – it may depend on your bible translation). What guidance do these verses give you about becoming compassionate?

Read Ephesians 4.11-16. Note Paul's desire that we attain the whole measure of the fullness of God. Invite God to do this work in you.

Prayerfully invite Jesus to develop your compassion even to the point of being a compassionate presence.

Livelihood development in Zimbabwe.

With over 1 billion people still living in extreme poverty and inequality growing within countries, the generation of sustainable income opportunities for people living in poverty has never been more important. UnitingWorld works with our partners around the world to provide small loans, vocational training and resources to people living in poverty. By doing this, we help people grow their own small businesses, earn an income, support their families and ultimately overcome the cycle of poverty.

UnitingWorld works with the Methodist Church in Zimbabwe's Development and Relief Agency (MeDRA) on projects which help people in remote communities generate a sustainable income through activities like carpentry, tailoring, beekeeping and raising chickens, pigs and goats. Over the last year we've supported over 230 people in Zimbabwe to learn new skills and access the resources and training they need to generate an income which helps them provide for their families. In an area where traditional harvests are declining, these projects are bringing hope and opportunities where they didn't exist before.
