news of the church 30th August, 2015

If you are new or visiting Adelaide West Uniting Church we are pleased you are here. A Welcome to Adelaide West information sheet is available in the foyer or from the stewards.

This week we return to the gospel of Mark after the lectionary has focussed on the Gospel of John for 5 weeks. Over five weeks the lectionary looked at one issue in John chapter 6 - Jesus as the bread of life. Now we come to this short, gritty, pointed reading in Mark's gospel. Mark is always to the point and always dramatic.

Mark raises the issue of tradition and what place this has in the life of the people of God. As is often the case the Pharisees and teachers set a trap for Jesus. He realises what the underlying issue is and shifts the conversation from tradition to how the tradition was being misused. Tradition can lead people to God or it can be used to justify what people want to do. This passage helps us to ask why we do what we do and whether what we do helps people to form a relationship with God or hinder them. In the end the question is how can we honour God with our hearts rather than by just what we say? Jesus is not saying that tradition is wrong but asking us to be clear about what we do and to do things for the right reasons. May the Holy Spirit give us the eyes to look at our life and our faith so that our hearts are transformed in ways that enable us to live by the commands of God.
